NATIVE PLANTS

What are Native Plants and Why Plant them in your Garden?

Native plants are plants that evolved in our area. They grew naturally here before humans began to bring in outside plants to grow and farm. Native plants adapted to the climate and cultural conditions of our area and became part of our ecosystem.

- Native plants do not need a lot of extra water.
- Native plants do not need pesticides. They are already acclimated to insect populations and they rarely need fertilizers.
- Insects need them to survive. 90% of insects depend on native plants for their survival. 37% of animal species eat herbivorous insects.
- Native plants are rarely invasive.
- Local wildlife, birds, and butterflies have a relationship with native plants. They rely on them for food, shelter, and nesting.
